Ms Ewi Stephanie Lamma, a research fellow with the Pan African Centre For Climate Policy in Cameroon due to her expertise in the domain of Sustainable Natural Resource Management spoke on the theme of the conference: "Chronicling Waste Management Solutions in Africa; the Way Forward". The conference was held from February 7th to 9th 2018. She gave a brief history of the Municipal solid waste trend within African cities and discussed the sources of waste, attempts to manage waste and challenges faced as a result taking her hometown Limbe, in the South West Region of Cameroon as a case study. She concluded with a call to diverse stakeholders to take part in this aspect of waste management in Africa. She encouraged the discovery of treasure hidden in waste and called on the government and donors to assist youths in making the best out of the waste already present within the continent. The goal of the after school program was fourfold:


